From the Pastor - Stop Staring, Start Praying

Years ago, we witnessed a unique phenomenon. In August 2017, we saw a total solar eclipse throughout the United States. There was a buzz in the air for this event but I also remember hearing doctors and health officials plead, "Don't stare directly into the sun!" But what did we all do? People stopped whatever they were doing and stared directly into the sky forgetting everything else.

There's a story of Scripture when the followers of Jesus are doing the same - just staring at the sky (Acts 1:6-14). They had just witnessed the strange event of Jesus ascending into heaven and they were just stuck there. Staring. It took two angels to jolt them out of this daze asking, "Men of Galilee... why are you standing here staring into heaven?" (Acts 1:11, NLT). Perhaps they were a little dumbfounded, or even nervous, because of what just happened. Not just the ascension, but the mission given by Jesus. His last words to them were, "You will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth" (Acts 1:8). They were about to be sent into the world on a mission.

This is exactly what unfolds in Acts. The Holy Spirit descends and these unqualified followers go from Jerusalem (their local community), to Judea and Samaria (the larger countryside), and to the very ends of the earth (places like Rome, Corinth and Ephesus). But the in-between step was to stop staring and start praying: "Then the apostles returned to Jerusalem... they all met together and were constantly united in prayer..." (Acts 1:12, 14). Prayer was the act of submission and anticipation for what God was going to do.

In the same way, we can get stuck staring - whether it's at the good news of what Jesus has done. Or we can get stuck staring at the problems that are all around us. Either way, we can't keep staring. Jesus has work for us to do. The in-between step from where we are now and where God wants to take us is prayer. My challenge to us at Wightman is that we need to stop staring and start praying. To do that, I want to offer this simple prayer guide based on ever expanding circles of ministry and witness. I encourage you to join me in prayer for each facet of our church as we submit to God and anticipate what He will do next.

Administrative Council Highlights

The Administrative Council of Wightman Methodist Church met Sunday, July 21, 2024 at 1:30 p.m. in the Educational Building Fellowship Hall.

Chairman Jeff Shacker called the meeting to order. He opened with Ecclesiastes 3:1-8 saying that there is a time for everything and we are now starting a new beginning. A motion was made to approve the minutes of the March 17, 2024 and the May 19, 2024 council meetings and the June 30, 2024 called council meeting. This was seconded. All minutes were approved as presented.



There was no old business and no new business.

Under committee reports, Missions Chairman Leonard May reported that he has discussed some ideas with Pastor Gryff Carosiello and will be seeking a leader for an international mission team.

Trustee Chairman Ken Cope has done a walk-thru of the facility for beautification and updating. The children's hallway and Sunday school rooms need new flooring and doors. Vinyl plank is being considered both for the children's area and the downstairs of the CLC. Repairs need to be made to the foundation of the CLC which has dropped and the roof of the CLC where the screws gaskets have deteriorated. Estimates need to be secured for all costs.

The youth had a great mission trip to Pennsylvania. A cookout is being held tonight at the Lighthouse to thank Chris and Madison Butler for their seven years of service to the youth ministry. Chris is retiring as Youth Minister at the end of July.

Children's Minister Jennifer Boozer stated that 107 children were registered for Vacation Bible School which was held in June. August 11 is Promotion Sunday. If possible, a bowling trip is being planned for August 11. More volunteers are needed in the children's department.

Worship Chairman Janet Davenport said that they had a productive meeting but would like more participation from attendees of the contemporary worship service. Communion will be returning to intinction rather than individual cups. On Promotion Sunday she will try to recruit more acolytes and cross bearers as the schedule needs to be revamped. Golden Age Sunday is in October.

There was no report from Evangelism.

Discipleship Chairman Henry Dominick would like access to some of the yearbook activities on the church web site so the information is available to new members and attendees. A Bible study on Exodus will be held on Tuesday nights from August 6 through September 10. The group would like to see the cooking ministry small group form again.

Congregational Care leaders Gary and Tina Hooker would like to have a representative from the contemporary service on their committee. They want to do more visitation. The bereavement area has been very busy but the committee is not purchasing all of the food.

P/SPRC Chairman Emily Cope expressed a huge welcome to our new pastor, Rev. Gryff Carosiello. The committee is looking for a new youth minister; however, Kenley Beckham has volunteered to coordinate youth activities until a new person is in place. Youth meetings begin Sunday, August 4, at the Lighthouse. Since our pastor has decided not to live in the parsonage, any thoughts on the future of the parsonage should be shared with Emily Cope or David Mitchell.

Safety Team leader Hunter Shaw reminded members that safety is everyone's responsibility.

Communications leader Julia Roach said to let her know if something is needed. During the traditional worship service today a projector bulb blew. The tech team wants to have all bulbs replaced. There are some lights in the sanctuary that need replacing and speakers in the CLC need to be serviced. The worship services were not broadcast on the VBS Sunday and the youth Sunday for privacy for the children and youth.

Contemporary Worship leader Zack Waites is selecting music to complement the sermon.

Pastor Gryff Carosiello stated that he is excited to be here. He is holding listening sessions to see if there are any common threads throughout the church. He would like prayers for the church to find a single focus to see what God is calling us to be.

There being no further business the meeting adjourned with prayer by Pastor Gryff Carosiello at 2:30 pm. The next scheduled council meeting is Sunday, September 15, 2024 at 1:30 p.m. with committees meeting at 12:30 p.m.
