From the Pastor - A New Thing

"Thus says the Lord, who makes a way in the sea, a path in the mighty waters..."Remember not the former things, nor consider the things of old. Behold, I am doing a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it? I will make a way in the wilderness and rivers in the desert."

Isaiah 43:16,18-19 (ESV)

This past month, the Global Methodist Church of South Carolina hosted its second annual gathering called Behold. In essence, this event will be our annual conference moving forward and our guiding passage is Isaiah 43:19. In the passage, God speaks to his people and tells them of the new thing that he is doing in their midst. All the misfortune, pain, and grief they've experienced will pass and God will bring new life. In the Global Methodist Church of South Carolina, we believe that God is wanting to do a new thing through every person and every church. Ultimately, God isn't done with his Church. He's not done with Wightman either.

In this new season of ministry, I've spent most of my initial time with you listening and asking questions. Too often, we try to rush in with answers without ever asking questions. We make assumptions and push our own personal agendas. The result is more hurt and damage. While I've been familiar with Wightman and its past, it was necessary that I spent this time listening and understanding where the congregation is, what it values, and where it hopes to go. It's also important for me to hear the wounds, hurt, and pain that has been felt over the months and years. Both the pain and praises are part of Wightman's story.

The good news is that God is still writing that story as we move forward. The good news is that Jesus is building his church "and all the powers of hell will not conquer it" (Matthew 16:18). Wightman's story isn't done. Our work is to discern what God wants the next chapter to be and then follow him as he leads us. But for us to see what God is doing now, we need to move beyond what has happened. Or as Isaiah puts it, "Remember not the former things, nor consider the things of old" (Isaiah 43:18). We can continue to celebrate and remember the good that God has done. We can continue to grieve the things that have caused harm over years. But we can't let the past (both good or bad) hold us prisoner. Instead, we need to lean into the new thing God is doing. Here at Wightman, God is going to "make a way in the wilderness and rivers in the desert" (Isaiah 43:19).
